School Money


Over the last couple of weeks in this newsletter we have mentioned that school dinner money should be paid in advance and brought up to date. At the last review earlier today there was a total

of £878 outstanding. All parents have been reminded of the need to log in to repay their balance but this large figure still remains overdue. A further reminder to all concerned was sent today by both text and email. If this relates to you please go on-line TODAY and make your payment. Please also include an additional £4.40 to cover next Monday and Tuesday.

This payment facility was set up following requests from parents to make paying easier but if the system fails to be used correctly we may have to reconsider this payment option.

For your information dinner money due on the 5th September for the half term to October will be £74.80 if you wish to pay this in full or £160.60 up until the Christmas break otherwise £11 per week should be paid each Monday (£2.20 a day).

Additionally, if you no longer wish your child to have school dinners or alternatively wish them to go onto school dinners from September please send a



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note into Mrs Parr on Monday. Thank you.







Netball Tournament



- 2. Listened to parents views through face-to-face forums and from responses to a questionnaire.


3. Actively encouraged 'pupil voice' and analysed responses to a pupils' questionnaire.



Year 6 Leavers


Next week we also say goodbye to our current Year 6 pupils. During their leavers' service on Tuesday morning,
