
FoDS Meeting


Chess Club

To ensure that our appointments run to schedule, we ask you to finish your appointment after ten minutes. We appreciate your support with this.




Reading Workshop



Thurstaston Plaque

Wirral Council is taking action to replace the brass map which was recently stolen from the viewing point at the top of Thurstaston Hill.


The plaque sat on a sandstone plinth at the highest point on the hill, and guided visitors to the panoramic views across the Dee to North Wales and the Mersey to Liverpool.

It was stolen in August and has not been found.

The replacement plaque will be produced using photographs of the original brass map – and that's where our school community can help.

The Council has some images which will help to produce the new plaque, but the Dawpool community can help by sharing their photographs of the map in its former glory.


This is no trick! You're in for a treat! - Bring a pumpkin to carve and we'll have sweets to eat!


